

## Curriculum vitae

**Michael Dymacek**, born 1943 in Brno.

University studies of theoretical mathematics finished at Masaryk University, Brno, with honors in 1965 (an equivalent of M.S. degree).

Part-time Assistant Professor at Technical University in Brno from 1963 to 1965 and at Masaryk University since 1964. After one-year military service, full-time Associate Professor at Masaryk University from 1966 to 1970.

During the Prague spring politically engaged, finally as a Chairman of the Union of University Students of Czech and Moravia (Oct. 1968 to May 1969), one of the most influential democratic institutions in Czechoslovakia at that time.

In 1969, following the first wave of political persecution, initially prohibited to teach and to publish, and at the beginning of 1970 given expulsion notice from University. Because the law was violated by the notice, the court was asked to decide but under the hard communist regime pressure the court also violated the law, confirming the notice.

Between 1973 and 1977 employed at the Kancelarske stroje trading, consultation and training company ("Office Machines") where responsible for training courses and education of system programmers on the IBM 360/370-class machines.

After signing the Charter 77 on Dec.1976, in the first group of 240 signatories, fired from Kancelarské stroje.

1970-1973 and 1977 to 1989 unemployed, or better, not allowed to be employed because of political persecution. Under constant surveillance of the secret state police. Undertook an intensive study of computer science, especially parallel processing and Artificial Intelligence, law, economics, sociology, and partly neurophysiology. Did also research in mathematical logic, set theory, partial integral equations, parallel processing (related to AI as well); interrelation of high-technology, economics, national security and politics; legal studies.

**Publications** : more than ten textbooks, starting in 1968 with Mathematical logic, so far the most extensive textbook about the topic ever written in Czech, then mostly textbooks oriented to computers. Number of original papers, mostly in manuscripts; in the late eighties original studies covering the problems of the communist system transformation (politics, economy, security), and some extensive legal studies.

Politically engaged after Nov.1989: one of the two leaders of the Civic Forum in Brno and Southern Moravia, since November 1989. Member of the Federal Parliament between January and June 1990. Member of the Brno City Parliament, Chairman of its Economic Development Committee from Nov. 1990 to Sept. 1994. Despite of his political activities he has never been a member of any political party.

In June 1992 founder and the main stockholder of the BIP Group, Inc., a private joint-stock company devoted to analysis, understanding and solution of problems of an economic transformation, particularly microeconomy.

BIP Group should serve as a (private and commercial) entity dealing with problems typically solved by regional institutions in advanced democratic countries. Since 1993 concentrated on the Brno Hub Airport Complex Project, where M.Dymacek is the author. At the same time extensive studies related to economic development, especially of economies in transition. An expert in public/private partnerships technologies.

Presentations on world top conferencies - Denver, Barcelona, Warsaw, Wien, Munich, Paris and prominent workshops in Geneva, Budapest, Zagreb, Sofia, Prague, invited to the White House conference in Cleveland 1995.

Currently a consultant of the UN Economic Commission for Europe, Geneva, and one of the founding members of its BOT Expert Group (a prominent body of around 25 top international experts on Public/Private Partnership technologies). A member of the Advisory Board of the World Development Federation, Atlanta.
