Hong Kong's Cyberport – Summary Paragraph

The Cyberport project is an important information infrastructure being developed on a 24-hectare land at Telegraph Bay in the Southern District of Hong Kong Island, at an estimated cost of US\$2 billion.

The Cyberport will open in phases between early 2002 and end 2003. It is a comprehensive development which will provide intelligent offices of about 110,000m², complemented by a hotel and a technology-themed educational, entertainment and retail complex. All Cyberport facilities will be networked through a state-of-the-art telecommunication infrastructure and will be situated within a campus-like environment.

The Cyberport will be the home for quality companies specialising in IT applications, information services and multimedia content creation. We are now inviting applications for Cyberport office tenancies and have so far received 69 applications from multinational, overseas and local companies.

The Cyberport promises us a strategic cluster of quality IT companies and professionals and a new international IT centre in Hong Kong. It is a symbol of our determination to build up Hong Kong as a leading digital city in Asia. A burgeoning international IT centre will be established at the Cyberport when it starts its first intake of tenants in early 2002.
